



Teach Physics 2018

The Teach Physics Internship Programme aims to increase the number of physics graduates choosing to train as teachers, by providing 4-5 week placements in school science departments for students to gain an intensive experience of teaching physics and broader school life.

The Ogden Trust is looking for schools in England to host interns in Summer 2018.

Deadline for schools to confirm participation in the Teach Physics Internship Programme is Friday February 9 2018.





The school's responsibilities will include:

- hosting one or two intern(s) for 4 - 5 weeks at the end of the summer term,
- conducting a telephone interview and having the final say on whether to accept the intern(s),
- hosting an induction day prior to the start of the placement,
- applying for DBS clearance for the intern(s), and
- providing a mentor and a clear timetable for the intern(s).

The Ogden Trust will:

- recruit and put forward interns to schools,
- share relevant information about the applicants with the schools,
- support the interns with an educational grant (£300 per week),
- reimburse the school the costs of the DBS clearance(s), and
- pay the school for administration costs (£100).

The intern(s) will:

- observe and assist with all aspects of teaching,
- plan and deliver their own lesson towards the end of their placement,
- give a presentation about careers for physicists/lead a careers workshop,
- run/assist with extra-curricular clubs and activities, and
- work with pupils with SEN and/or on the G&T register.
